#### What does it mean to die with dignity?

Good, now that I have your attention: I know that I have broached this subject with you at least once in my time here – most likely in this year's Ash Wednesday service. What I am asking you to do today is to think about this question from a different angle. What does it mean when something that we *do* or participate in, has run its course?

As many of you know, my home congregation of Beechview, nestled on the trolley line in the South Hills of Pittsburgh, has closed up shop. COVID was the final nail in the coffin for a congregation that had been declining for 3-4 decades. I have many cherished memories from my time growing up in that congregation. My Sunday school teacher, Anne Falvo, threatened to send me to the moon quite a few times if I couldn't sit still and just pay attention.

My oldest brother, Michael, was married in the sanctuary on a December night in 1998 when the snowflakes fell thickly on the earth, threatening to keep some of our extended relatives stuck out on the road. There, on a sunny day in May of 2007, we held my other brother Shaun's funeral.

#### I carry those moments with me. They were formative and helped shape me into the man, the pastor I am today.

One of Beechview's final acts was allotting to each of its members a portion from the sale of its building, to be used for the benefit of non-profit organizations. Some of the church's members opted to donate to homeless shelters. Some donated to animal rescue organizations in the City of Pittsburgh. I am proud to announce that my mother, Sue Pfeuffer, has designated her monetary gift of \$10,000 go to Flushing Presbyterian Church.

*That*, my friends, is going out with dignity. *That is going out with style*. The manner in which Beechview has gone out rings with joy; with its final act the congregation has chosen not to wallow in its tears but to take action and **to serve the Lord**. They have fought the good fight, they have finished the race, they have kept the faith. I am forever indebted to my years spent there and I could not be prouder of my humble origins.

Those worshipers are losing a vital part of their identity and yet even so, they close the book on that chapter in their lives while thinking not of themselves, but of others. Please say a prayer for all of them, because the road to closure was long and arduous, winding and full of grief. Thank the Lord for this group of people in southwestern Pennsylvania, many of whom you will most likely never meet. May God bless each of them as they continue with their life's work, as they move on to find new worshiping homes, and as they grow and walk with God.

*Voices for Children* provides restorative services for abused and neglected children, protects our vulnerable children through advocacy, and prevents abuse and neglect in our communities through education. In Genesee County, 25-40 children come to the center every week, that is more than 100 snacks and beverages every month. **During the month of June we will be collecting snacks and beverages:** 

- Snacks: Any individually packaged ones that don't spoil quickly. Individually packaged chips, crackers, cookies, fruit roll-ups, fruit snacks, even pudding and Pop Tarts.
- Beverages: For the younger kids juice boxes of any kind/flavor. For the teens soda (root beer, Sprite/Sierra Mist, Coke/Diet Coke, Pepsi/Diet Pepsi, etc.). Bottled water is always needed and sparkling water is also accepted.

There is a bin in the narthex for your donations.



We will be having worship services outdoors in our pavilion on June 16, July 7 and August 18. Bring a folding chair for comfort, if you would like, and dress casually for a non A/C environment (in the event of cold or wet weather, we will move indoors). Come and enjoy worshipping the Lord in God's great outdoors!



*Sleep in Heavenly Peace* has requested that our congregation provide funding for building supplies and bedding for 15 beds. Each bed comes with mattress, mattress cover, pillow, sheets and a comforter at a cost of \$250 each. There will be a board in the narthex with beds that you can take: Whole bed - \$250, Half a bed - \$125, and Fifth of a bed - \$50, Tenth of a bed - \$25. Any other size donation will also be accepted and applied to the cost of a bed. Pease make checks payable to Flushing Presbyterian Church and indicate "Bed" in the memo line.

**Bed Building Event** will take place here at our church from 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM on Saturday, September 14. Come and join with other members of our community to build beds for children that don't have one of their own. No experience necessary. All skill levels welcome and no tools are needed. Ages 10-100; all children 10-18 must be accompanied by an adult.

### Expanding our view of service

I have to work two jobs, and you invited my child to spend afternoons crafting with you. My car broke down, and you repaired it." Then the King will say, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father ... *whatever* you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:34, 40, NIV; emphasis added).
