# May 2024 Newsletter



"When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son.
<sup>2</sup> But the more they were called, the more they went away from me.
They sacrificed to the Baals and they burned incense to images.
<sup>3</sup> It was I who taught Ephraim to walk, taking them by the arms;
but they did not realize it was I who healed them.
<sup>4</sup> I led them with cords of human kindness, with ties of love.
To them I was like one who lifts a little child to the cheek, and I bent down to feed them.

#### Hosea 11:1-4, New International Version

The very merry month of May is upon us, and with it comes the annual celebration of Mother's Day. With that comes the opportunity to examine how we look at God's relationship with us as a parental figure. Of course, there's the common image and reference of God as Father; Jesus even referred to the Lord with the Aramaic word '*abba*, which is more of a familiar title of affection than a formal "father." And, given the patriarchal nature of society in biblical times, it is only natural for writers and the priesthood to think of the Divine in male terms. After all, we tend to think that God looks a lot like us! And since most of the literate members of society -- the ones who held power as clergy and scribes -- were male, they saw in God a lot of their own features.

In spite of this, there was room in the biblical imagination for God as a feminine! The passage above illustrates that quite nicely, in fact. It comes to us from the minor prophet Hosea and serves as a metaphor for God's relationship with the wayward child, Israel. God's people had done wrong in the sight of the Lord and God's disappointment is palpable. How many of you have had similar experiences as parents? When you try to do right by your kids and for some inexplicable reason they make decisions to their own detriment. I think this is something of a universal experience for parents, and yet we try to love them through such experiences to the best of our ability.

God's ability to love far surpasses ours, and yet I imagine God gets exasperated by our choices at times. In the passage above God is the speaker, listing all the things that the mother does for a child in the Ancient Near East – teaching the child how to walk and feeding him as well. The reference in verse 4 "To them I was like one who lifts a little child to the cheek, and I bent down to feed them" is one that heavily implies the act of breastfeeding! More crucially than the focus on God as feminine, however, is the underlying emphasis of this passage is the parent's stubborn and unyielding love – a love that simply will never let us go.

#### "Wood" You Like to Learn Woodcarving?

Members of the Michigan Woodcarving Association have formed a woodcarving club that meets here at Flushing Presbyterian Church. The club meets on Thursdays from 6 pm to 8 pm. No previous woodcarving experience is necessary to attend the club. Members will work with all levels of carvers. There is no cost to attend a meeting. For folks wishing to try woodcarving, a knife can be borrowed during the meeting and a piece of bass wood will be provided. It is advised to wear cut resistant gloves while carving, especially to those new to woodcarving. This club is not set up as a class setting, but rather a place to learn to carve one on one without any pressure, from experienced carvers in a friendly environment. Kids can attend a meeting if mature enough and strong enough to control a very woodcarving knife sharp and are always accompanied by a parent or guardian.
